MOVE

Message Scripture: Read Luke 15.

Scripture questions:

- What do each of these parables have in common?
- In the first two parables, how does each person respond when the object goes missing?
- How does each person respond when the object is found?
- What is the father's attitude throughout the parable of the lost son?
- What do these parables say about God's attitude towards those who are lost?

Reflection questions:

- Who are some people around you that have need for a contagious Christian in their life? This could be a family member, classmate, friend, neighbor, or coworker, just to name a few.

- What holds you back from sharing the love of God with the people you just thought of? What costs might you have to pay? Relate this to the cost paid by the characters in the Luke 15 parables.

- What are the benefits of living as a contagious Christian? Do these benefits outweigh the costs?

Application:

- Choose 3 non-Christians in your life to pray for daily. The place to start when developing God's heart for the lost is focused prayer!

Guiding Thoughts:

- To become contagious Christians we need to have the proper motivation. Sharing the gospel because it is "the right thing to do" or because we would otherwise feel guilty is improper motivation. We need first and foremost, to have God's heart.

- When you really value something and it is lost, you naturally want to search for it. Our goal throughout this teaching series MOVE is to develop God's heart for the lost. Every moment is an opportunity to be a contagious Christian. God's desire is to turn the routine into the remarkable in every area of your life.
