## Martha Lane Dyer

August 04, 1957 to March 17, 2019

Martha, born August 4th, 1957 in Pomona, California, was adopted by James and Bonnie Dyer and taken directly from the hospital. On Saint Patrick's Day, March 17th, she stepped over the threshold from mortality to immortality, from her home in Spokane to her heavenly home, from making it from day to day to making it all the way, where she is face to face with Jesus.



Martha graduated High School in June, 1976 from Buena High in Ventura, CA. She continued to attend college and earned an associate's degree in general education in 1979, a bachelor's degree in Biblical Literature/Christian Education with a minor in early childhood development from Northwest University in 1981. She earned a teaching certificate to teach in Christian school from Evangelical Teacher' training Association in 1981.

She held the role of a Children's pastor in Kirkland, WA at Korean New Life Church. She served as the department leader in Girl's Ministries at Ridgeview Christian Center for 8 years until she was given the ultimate "honor star" in her "homecoming."

She loved biking, reading, all crafts (especially x-stitching and scrapbooking), and shopping. She enjoyed participating in and leading bible studies. She appreciated chatting with her mom daily, her weekly Costco runs with her sister, Debra, her semi-regular visits with Kathy Barclay, scrapbooking with Tricia, times with Chris, and all her involvement with her RCC-church family.

Martha did not enjoy cooking meals, but she did enjoy baking and candy making. She had a distinct dislike for bananas, but an incredible palate for chocolate. Hers were the best peanut butter balls. She successfully held an annual baking sale to fund raise for her Girl's Ministries program.

Martha was an outspoken follower of Jesus Christ and was grateful for her spiritual heritage. She wanted to introduce as many children into a growing relationship with Jesus as she could. And she spent her life toward that pursuit.

She was preceded in death by her father, James Ray Dyer. Martha is survived by her mother, Bonnie Dyer, her sister, Debra Smith, nephew Kody Wood and Niko Smith, niece, Tori Socha, sister-cousin Faye Jett, sister-cousin Chris Monroe, and brother-cousin, Bill Baldwin. She has left a deep imprint upon her family at Ridgeview Christian Center. And lastly, she has left a fur-baby, Kirby.
