The Mount of Transfiguration

"Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed" (Mark 1:35).

All of us need Mount of Transfiguration moments where God removes the veil from our eyes and we see more of His glory.

When you experience the glory of God, you want to camp there.

"We are not built for the mountains. Those are for moments of inspiration. That is all. We are built for the valley and that is where we prove our mettle. Spiritual selfishness always wants repeated moments on the mount. The test of our spiritual life is the power to descend; if we have the power to rise only, something is wrong." -Oswald Chambers, My Utmost for His Highest.

"It was a holy moment and for a short time they were more reverent" (Luke 8:35, MSG).

"Later, a great many people from the Gerasene countryside got together and asked Jesus to leave - too much change, too fast, and they were scared" (Luke 8:37, MSG).

One of the greatest challenges coming down the mountain is walking back into the same situations, the same relationships, the same problems, and the same temptations.

Mountaintop experiences don't always resolve our problems, but they reveal our issues.

Mountaintop experiences are means not ends.

"We see His glory on the mount, but we never live for His glory there." -Oswald Chambers
